

Licensing for Unmanned Aircraft



Aerial Application and Surveillance

Step 1: Obtain a FAA Part 107 Drone Pilots License (Renewal every 24 Months)

- Test must be taken at an FAA Facility
- Cost: \$175
- Test will be 60 questions and you must score at least 70% to pass

Step 2: Obtain an FAA Section 44807 Certification

• This is for drones weighing 55 pounds or more, either dry or loaded.

Step 3: Obtain an FAA 3rd Class Medical Certificate

- Required for any drone with a gross takeoff weight of 55 pounds or greater

Step 4: Obtain an FAA Part 137 Aerial Application License

- Not ALL substances fall under this regulation

Step 5: Drone Registration

- \$5 per drone and registration will be valid for three years
- FAA registration certificate must be in your possession when you fly
- Registration number MUST be affixed to your aircraft

Step 6: Obtain a Commercial or Private License with the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) – commercial is for hire; private is to produce agricultural commodities

- Exam(s) must be taken at a PSI Location; privates must take class, then exams
- License Cost: \$200/year for commercial; \$100/5 years for private
- Exams are \$64 each; commercials take 3 exams (1 General and 2 Category); privates take two (private applicator exam and aerial)
- Privates and commercials must take Aerial category; commercials take additional category exam
 - TDA has multiple categories that range from Pasture and Rangeland to Aquatic Pest Control
